

Cadbury, Henry J. ed. ***George Fox's "Book of Miracles"*** (2000), ed. Henry J. Cadbury, Forwards by Rufus M. Jones, Jim Pym and Paul Anderson. Catalogs over 150 recorded instances of healing by George Fox. \$17

Feagins, Mary E. B. ***Becoming Myself: My Life in Letters and Verse*** (2001). A former Guilford College professor and poet recounts her personal, professional and spiritual journey. \$15

Hickey, Damon D. ***Sojourners No More: The Quakers in the New South, 1865-1920*** (1997). The author gives a scholarly, lively account of southern Quakers as they confront slavery, cope with the devastation wrought by the Civil War and search for a new identity. \$20

Hilty, Hiram. ***By Land and By Sea: Quakers Confront Slavery and its Aftermath In North Carolina*** (1993). Describes North Carolina Friends' unique approach to the problems of slavery. Suitable for readers of all ages, indexed, illustrated. \$13

Hinshaw, Mary Edith. ***Pioneers in Quaker Education: The Story of John W. and Mary C. Woody*** (1992). A granddaughter tells the story of a couple instrumental in the founding of six Quaker colleges. \$12

Hinshaw, Seth B. ***The Spoken Ministry Among Friends*** (1987). An overview of vocal ministry among Friends over the past three centuries with special reference to the work of pastoral ministers in NCYM-FUM. \$9.50

Hinshaw, Seth B. ***The Carolina Quaker Experience, 1665-1985: An Interpretation***. Describes North Ca. Quakers' rich history. Includes maps, pictures, bibliography, index. \$16

Hinshaw, Seth B. ***Friends Worship Today: Contemporary Concepts and Practices*** (1991) An overview describing similarities among contemporary Friends' worship practices. \$6.50

Hinshaw, Seth B. ***Life in the Quaker Lane*** (1990) The autobiographical story of prolific author and former executive secretary of NYCM-FUM \$7.50

Hood, Henry G., Jr. ***The Public Career of John Archdale, 1642-1717*** (1976) by Henry G. Hood, Jr. A pamphlet in which a former Guilford college professor of history outlines the career of Quaker governor John Archdale. \$2

Newlin, Algie I., ***The Battle of Lindley's Mill*** (1975) (reprinted 2010) . Fought near Spring Meeting six

months after the Battle of Guilford Court House, the Battle of Lindley's Mill was almost entirely a civil war between Whigs and Tories for control of North Carolina. \$7.50

Newlin, Angie I. ***The Battle of New Garden*** (1977) (reprinted 1995). The little-known story of one of the most important "minor battles" of the Revolutionary War in North Carolina. \$7.50

Histories of North Carolina Friends Meetings

Cane Creek: Mother of Meetings (1995) by Bobbie Teague. This illustrated, indexed history describes the settlement of Cane Creek Valley by Quakers who established Cane Creek Meeting in 1751 and went on to start seven other Quaker meetings that exist today. \$13

Deep River Friends: A Valiant People (1985 revised and updated 2009) by Cecil E. Haworth. Illustrated, indexed history of Deep River Meeting from 1753 to the present. \$21.50

Friends at Back Creek: Into the Third Century (1993) by Barbara N. Grigg and Myrle L. Walker. Located in Randolph County, Back Creek Meeting's history spans more than 250 years. \$10

Greensboro Monthly Meeting (1987) by Hiram H. Hilty. An illustrated, indexed history of the meeting and its relationship to older Guilford County meetings as well. \$7.50

New Garden Friends Meeting: the Christian People Called Quakers (updated 2001) by Hiram H. Hilty. Illustrated, indexed history of the oldest monthly meeting in Guilford County. \$13

New Hope Friends Meeting and the Elroy Community (1987) by James K. Thompson. \$7.50
